President Pendergast called for a motion to accept the minutes of the January meeting. Anthony Adsit made the motion. It was seconded by Ed Burke. Motion passed.

Treasurer Mike Hanley gave his report which covered the months of November and December of 2018, as well as January 2019. He reported that he has paid National dues of the members paying through the local chapter.

President Pendergast called for a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Motion was made by Don Derr, seconded by Ed Burke and passed.

Letter from the President

I read the minutes from the BOG Meetings and read the discussion of merging regions to make one. This does not set well with me along with many of the members in the High Rollers Chapter. I feel this will cause dissension within the chapter.

The merging of regions is a sign of organizational weakness and struggles. The Western Region is the entire state of Nevada. Getting around the state isn't the easiest. Now there's discussion of adding the Southwest Region. That will be a long drive for the region director. This will add 235,695 square miles or make the region 652 miles longer. Now if I were a rancher that would be great, but we are talking about a merger of 2 big areas. I can't speak for the Arizona chapters, but I know Albuquerque is pretty active.

The problem I see is a lot of you are burned out and tired of being the only ones doing things. You need to have a membership table and brochures out at every event you go to. Find that younger crowd. Why can't the Southwest Region show some leadership and appoint someone for region director? People are out there and looking to join clubs like ours. If you want to redraw lines, maybe you should be asking the ones that have made the chapters and regions what they are.

I know the end game here is to host a regional tour, but we don't have to do it by merging regions. If we need to partner up with a neighboring region to put on a really nice regional or national tour, we will ask them to help. Look at the AACA; they have multiple regions in all the states.

When I was asked to take the reigns eight years ago the High Rollers was spiraling out of control. When Farrow Smith came to me and asked me to take the presidency, I was reluctant, but this was a Charter member and a pillar of the community asking. We turned the organization around and weathered the storm. It didn't happen overnight, but by going out and putting information out and talking to people attending other model car club meetings, I recruited new members.

Today we have over 60 members and continue to grow despite the attrition and loss of a few members due to moving and just not participating throughout the year. I have a tendency to guilt people into joining, so I've been told. Most of the time they stay.

As I look at the 2019 High Rollers Board of Directors and list of Committee Chairs, this is the best in the eight years I have held office. To come from a spiraling membership to today, I'm very happy with the way it has turned out. Don't get me wrong, we have had some great volunteers that have put their hearts and souls into various positions. This year is turning out to be the best yet. I wasn't for the name change and I am not for the merger of regions. Don't do it!

I would like to thank all the chairs for their thorough reports at the monthly meeting. Also, would like to thank HB for volunteering Norma for the annual Christmas Banquet Chair.

Editor's Note

PONTIAC - We Built Excitement! If you're over 50, you were probably shocked when on October 31st 2010, General Motors ended the nearly 85 year run of Pontiac. How could this be?!


Pontiac was founded in 1926 as a "companion make" to GM's Oakland brand...part of Alfred Sloan's plan for "a car for every purse and purpose". Positioned just above Chevrolet in the GM hierarchy, the first Pontiacs were basically Chevrolets with a six cylinder engine. Sales took off and Pontiac was soon outselling Oakland. When the Great Depression hit, General Motors had nine car brands, and a retrenchment of sorts was in order. Buick's companion Marquette, and Oldsmobile's Viking were dropped. But Pontiac was selling better than Oakland... so Oakland got axed and Pontiac survived. Pontiac settled in to it's place in the five-brand line up from GM (Cadillac's companion; LaSalle was dropped after 1940)....and that is the way the world would remain for more than 50 years until GM launched the Saturn brand in 1985.

In June of 2009, the once unthinkable happened. General Motors filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection. As part of the restructuring, the Pontiac division was closed. An inglorious end to one of America's most iconic brands.

I have a certain soft spot for our Car of the Month: Paul and Ruth Rolland's 1949 Pontiac Streamliner. One of my earliest childhood memories was of our family's 49 Pontiac and the day my Dad said it was headed to the scrapyard. I asked him why...and he pointed to the rocker panels under the door...or where they should have been. "It's too rusted to be safe anymore" he said. And so began my lifelong dread of the tin worm. That was nearly 60 years ago. Which, when I think about it, makes the condition of the Rolland's Pontiac all that much more amazing. I hope you enjoy their story...or should I say Baby's story?

Hello! My name is Baby. I'm a 1949 Pontiac Coupe Sedan Deluxe. I've been in Paul's family all my life. My original caretaker was his great aunt Amy. Paul is my fourth caretaker in his family. Paul and I met when he was 13 years old and it was love at first sight. He would visit his aunt Rusty, Amy's daughter during the summer. She became my second caretaker when Amy was no longer able to see very well. At the time he asked his aunt if he could become my next caretaker. 

February 22-24, 2019

The 2019 Pahrump, Nevada, Hot Air Balloon Festival will be on Friday, February 22 – Sunday, February 24, 2019. The car show will be on Saturday, February 23, 2019.

The Balloon Festival will be held at Petrack Park, 1301 Highway 160, Pahrump. Admission to the event is free; however, there are charges, depending on what you may participate in.

The car show will be held on Saturday, February 23, 2019. There is no entry fee for the car show. The car show starts at 9:00 A.M. with awards to be presented at 3:00 P.M. Awards will be announced from the stage area. Unlike past years, this year's cars in the show will not be out front, but will line up on Basin Avenue.

To reach Basin Avenue take Highway 372 west to Blagg. Blagg is the second roundabout on Highway 372. When you reach Blagg, turn right, or north, to Basin. All vehicles in the car show will enter Basin from the west. The organizers feel this will avoid any confusion, if vehicles were to come from two different directions. They, also, feel using Blagg, rather than Highway 160, will avoid any congestion around the Park.

Vendors will be selling tee shirts at the event/car show. Ballots can be purchased for the People's Choice Award. One dollar (\$1.00) from each ballot purchased for the People's Choice Award will go to the People's Choice winner.

The Pahrump Balloon Festival brings together more than 30 plus hot air balloon pilots from the Western states. Bring the family to enjoy hot air balloon rides, music, entertainment, great food, vendors, a high school rodeo, and more.

A hot air balloon glow show will be Friday evening, February 22, 2019, and Saturday, February 23, 2019, at 6:00 P.M. where more than a dozen balloons will illuminate the area, as they synchronize their balloons to music.

Again, admission to the festival is free. Rodeo tickets start at \$5.00 for students. A three-day pass to the rodeo is \$20.00. The rodeo is sponsored by the Pahrump Valley High School. A Mutton Busting will take place both Friday and Saturday at 7:00 P.M. Pre-sale tickets to the carnival are available from the Pahrump Valley Chamber of Commerce, 775-727-5800.

Tethered balloon ride tickets are \$10.00 and are available at the festival. For hot air balloon super fans, a \$10.00 Field Pass includes an up-close view of Friday and Saturday nights "Glow in the Park". Also, available is a Cold Inflation which is a walk inside a balloon.

You will find attached a schedule of the three days of activities—Friday, February 22 – Sunday, February 24—as well as a map of the Park/carnival area.


The parade route on Water Street (south to north) is 95% downhill. All you clutch dudes (and dudettes) can coast most of the way. See the accompanying area map for reference.

KINGMAN, ARIZONA, FUN RUN, MAY 3-5, 2019

The 32nd Annual Route 66 Fun Run will take place in Kingman, Arizona, May 3 – 5, 2019. The 2018 Fun Run had 788 registrants.

The Historic Route 66 Fun Run began as a dedication of Historic Arizona Route 66 in 1988. Route 66 opened in 1926, but was decommissioned with the opening of I-40. There were 152 entries for the 1988 Fun Run with over 60 cars making the complete journey from Seligman to Topock.

The 2018 Fun Run had entries from Las Vegas, Henderson, Utah, New Mexico, and various area of California with most entries from areas of Arizona. There was no Grapes of Wrath award for the 2018 Fun Run; however, there was an award for the longest distance traveled to the Fun Run which was in a 1981 VW bus from Argentina. The award for participation outside of the United States went to an entry from New Zealand.

In addition to the May 3-5, 2019, Fun Run on Route 66, there are many, many other small towns and points of interest to be seen. For example, you can visit the courthouse in Kingman where Carole Lombard and Clark Gable were married, then visit the hotel in Oatman where they honeymooned. The Beale Hotel in Kingman was once the home to Andy Devine, the movie personality. The section of Route 66 just east of Valle Vista, Arizona, is alleged by locals to be the longest continuous curve on a U.S. Highway, approximately seven miles. The Route 66 River Bridge once carried travelers across the Colorado River toward Needles, California, and then a long trek across the dreaded Mohave Desert. This old, arched steel bridge now supports pipeline; and travelers cross the river on I-40.

The Fun Run consists of events Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, May 3rd, 4th, and 5th. As this time approaches, further details can be provided; however, you can find more information on the web site.

You will find attached an entry form for the 2019 Fun Run. As Tom Rowlett suggested, if you plan to enter the Fun Run, or just go as a spectator, it is important to make a hotel reservation as soon as possible.
