Anatomy of a Professional Photo Shoot

Who, What, Where, When, How & Why

Who

The people involved with this photo shoot are a diverse group and all have different backgrounds. Jordan "Joker" Smith is the main instigator of this effort. Joker is a Lt Colonel in the U.S. Air Force. He is a man of many talents. He is a drone pilot (Joker is his callsign). He is a professional photographer. He is a collector of vintage cars. And, of course he **is** a joker!

Another person involved in this photo shoot is David Keetch. David has a collection of six vintage cars. All of them are of exceptional restoration quality and four of his six cars could easily be described as "concourse" quality cars. David is a veteran of the U.S. Navy and after retiring from the Navy, he also had a second career with UPS.

John Pendergast and John Munoz are both members in the same car club, The Vintage Motor Car Club of America (VMCCA) as David and some of the others involved in this photo shoot. They have vintage cars and are also both past executive members of the club. Also, they both work for the same national equipment rental company in Las Vegas.



Joe Provenza is also a mutual friend of Joker, David, John and John; and also, a member of the VMCCA. Joe is a retired engineer and amateur photographer. He also has a small vintage car collection.

David Keetch III is the grandson of David Keetch. David III along with his wife, Jenifer, assisted in the photo shoot. David III and Jenifer are also avid car enthusiasts with several collector cars of their own, although some are not yet vintage.

Others who have contributed to this photo shoot at one point or another were Karl and Stephanie Ferazzi, former VMCCA members and Keith Cobb with the Nevada DOT.



What

As an active officer in the Air Force, Joker is living in Las Vegas temporarily while taking a four-month advanced course on drones at Creech Air Force Base. Since David and Joker have been acquaintances for some time, David invited Joker to use his house during Joker's stay in Las Vegas. In his role as a professional photographer, Joker is on the staff of the "Linkage" a prestigious automotive publication. Joker took the photograph featured on the magazine cover of the fall, 2022 edition. He also wrote the accompanying automotive article in the magazine.

In an ensuing conversation between David and Joker, the subject of David's 1963 Pontiac Bonneville convertible came up. This car is a sterling example of a perfect restoration. In addition, this particular car also has a removable hard top, making it very rare (maybe only four are in existence). As a photojournalist, Joker got an inspiration to submit a photo of this car for the cover of a future issue of Linkage. Thus, a plan was hatched.

Where

Since David's Pontiac has a beautiful, lustrous deep black color, it would make a very interesting, if not mysterious, photo if taken at night. The photo would be particularly stunning if the car was in a special place and had special lighting on it with darkness in the background.



One thing led to another and to add even more of a mysterious allure to the photo, it was decided that it should be taken alongside the Extraterrestrial Highway near Area 51 in Nevada. And to add to that, the car would be photographed directly under the Extraterrestrial Highway sign just off of Nevada Highway 375 near the community of Crystal Springs.

When

After much discussion and planning, April Fools Day, 2023 was the designated date for the photo shoot. However, the joke was on us. After a false start, the shoot actually took place on April 2nd.

How


Now the fun starts! All of the members of the group started out at about 3:00pm for the trek to the final photo location. It was about a 100-mile drive from Las Vegas up Hwy 93 in south central Nevada. Joker, the consummate planner, provided all in the group with walkie-talkies so we could keep in touch with each other during the drive.

On March 31, we all met at a local restaurant and reviewed the detailed written guide that Joker had developed. It was essential that all involved knew what was expected (and what to do for the unexpected). Joker led the discussion. Joe provided some safety tips. Keith provided helpful information as it pertained to Nevada DOT guidelines. From everyone who spoke, it was stressed that safety was the most important element of this photo shoot.

John and John had positioned a man-lift at the site the prior day. It was sourced from the rental company where they worked. This piece of equipment was essential for the main effect of the shoot. The lift, with John Pendergast in it, was positioned high above (about 30 ft.) the Pontiac which was parked next to the Extraterrestrial Hwy sign. Up on the lift with John was an extremely bright spot light – 100,000 lumens!

On cue from Joker, John would turn the other-worldly light on while he was directly above the Pontiac giving the illusion that the light beam shining on the car was coming from a UFO. Of course, the lift with John in it was not in the picture. For a more surreal effect, a 12ft. ladder was set up to capture the shot from above rather than from ground level. After Joker set up the proper camera settings for nighttime photos, Joe took the pictures from the top of the ladder while Joker and David were staged with the car.

Joker and David dressed up in black suits, black ties and sunglasses giving them a "Men in Black" look. Numerous shots were taken of Joker and David in different positions around the car. In one shot Joker was looking
