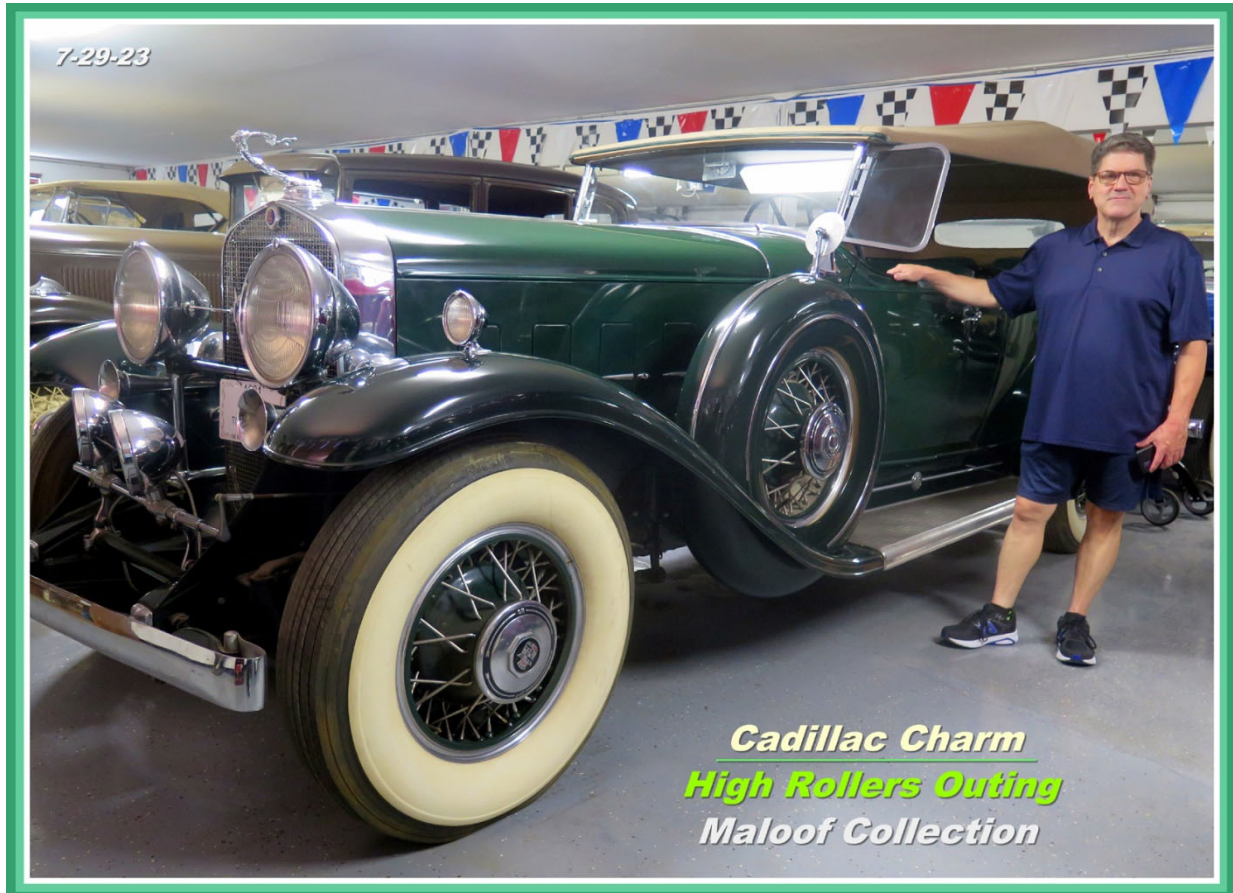

located in McPherson, Kansas was chartered in 1887. It is associated with the Church of the Brethren and accordingly it is a non-profit institution as defined by their 501 (C)(3) status. The college started with 60 students and a faculty of 5. From its meager beginnings it has now grown to a sprawling 27-acre campus with over 800 students on the west side of McPherson, Kansas.

Excerpts From The Rear View Mirror



1940 tips for crossing the Silver State

Exploring "the great unknown" with the WPA's classic auto guide

In 1940 travelers already were flocking to Nevada's alpine retreats and tiny neon desert oases. Between overheated radiators and hard luck at the blackjack tables, these explorers also discovered campgrounds, historical sites and other outdoor attractions.

Travelers of the day could find help in *Nevada: A Guide to the Silver State*. Originally published in 1940 by the Nevada Writers' Project of the Work Projects Administration, the guide offers eloquent mile-by-mile descriptions of highways, scenery and recreation in Nevada — "the great unknown," as the WPA writers called the state.

Following are some of their observations on what to see and do in Nevada, 1940 style:

Boulder City: It is as spick and span as though it were in [the] charge of Dutch housewives. Above the wide streets, which follow the curves of the hills, are houses of varying designs on delightfully landscaped terraces.

Elko: Seen from the railroad it is not impressive; the wide street bisected by the tracks is lined with buildings erected for the most part in the 1880s and 1890s, and false fronts are still among them. But a cue to the town's true character is seen even from the train; only two lots away from a small house dripping Victorian trimmings is a cocktail bar whose Bakelite and chromium elegance would fit well into upper Fifth Avenue in New York.

Hawthorne: The sight of sailors and marines among the barren mountains here is startling ... Hawthorne is truly the West in its scorn for small change; a 35-cent breakfast will be given for 30 cents if the unfortunate traveler must complete his payment with five pennies.

Las Vegas: The town is particularly lively at night. Neon lights call attention to the bars, gambling and night clubs in which Hollywood celebrities, miners, prospectors, divorcees, corporation presidents, cowboys and little old maids bent on seeing life at last, add to the stacks of silver dollars and watch the whirl of roulette wheels. Some restaurants are crowded until dawn.

Reno: U.S. 395 goes south through the fertile Truckee Valley with signs on both sides of the road advertising "Guest Ranches" for divorce seekers who prefer the moonlight and tree toads and the smell of the county yards to the gay night spots of "The Biggest Little City in the World."

Sparks: The piece de resistance in some local hotels is the stuffed pheasant; when the waiter removes a large silver service cover he brings into view two birds erect in a field of wild rice. The meat has been cooked and cleverly inserted into the original skin without disarranging a single feather.

Tonopah: This town, in a high, bare saddle, has the intense sunlight that up here gives some kinds of glass the rich purple tinge frequently seen in the Southwest; even the headlights of old motor cars have a lavender cast.

U.S. 50: Hawks and buzzards swim overhead, and long-tailed black-and-white magpies are along the roadway. Now and then an eagle soars above a lofty peak. In the early morning or late afternoon, a solitary coyote may cross the road and then trot off to a hummock from which he can watch the traveler pass.

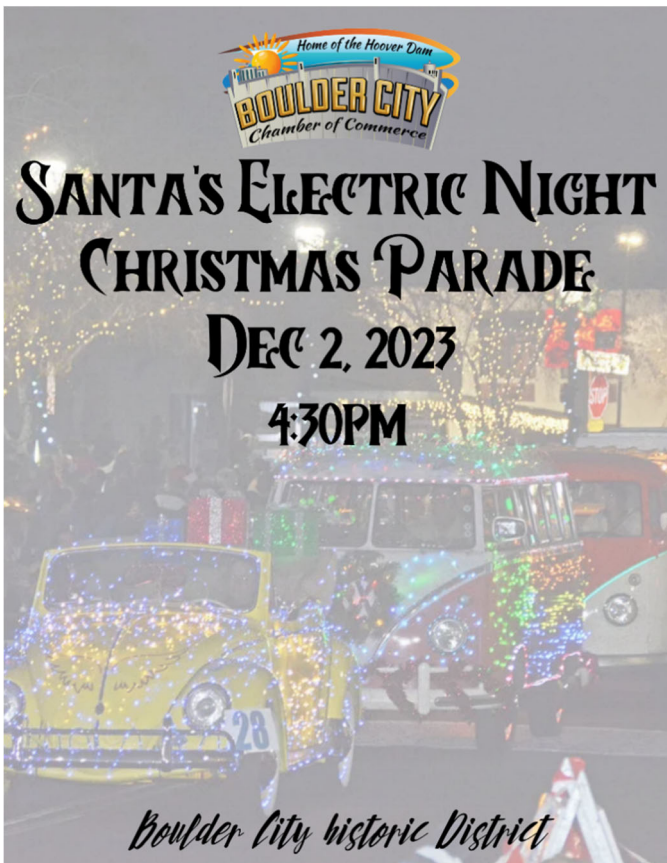
