

Desert Wildlife Refuge Tour - November 18, 2023

Recently I took a drive out to The Desert Wildlife Research Center just to see what it was all about, and much to my surprise, there is a full-blown center there. The trails are wheel chair accessible and some are short and some are longer. The trails are well compacted and maintained. I have suggested making this tour for a few years now and no one has volunteered to take it on. It's a nice easy drive out past the Paiute Golf Course a few miles then turn Right at the Desert Wildlife Sign. It's a fully paved road all the way. This is a must see if you are curious about the desert and what is out there. There's a spring that boils out of the ground feeding a pond and Cottonwood trees. At one time this was a full-on ranch. So, join us on a tour of an Oasis in the desert. We will meet up at 8am in the Santa Fe Mining Co. Parking lot, 5021 N. Rainbow. We will leave sharply at 8:15am and drive as a group out there. Afterwards we will travel as a group to the Paiute Golf Course Club house for lunch.


